### Reinforce Language of Structure through Detail

Details (ornament) reinforce geometry
Expression of structure through detail
Not applied, but integral to design
Solid/void fluctuate; ambiguous reading of surface
Abstraction of form; activation of surface through 'transparency'
(slutsky/rowe definition, in/out surface, layering)

Hierarchy of structure and skin, use of geometry of grid
