Why Study the Relational Model?
Most widely used model.
Vendors: IBM/Informix, Microsoft, Oracle, sybase, etc.
*Legacy systems" in older models
e.g., IBM's IMS
Object-oriented concepts have recently merged in
object-relational model
Informix->IBM DB2, Oracle 8i

Relational Database: Definitions

- Relational database: a set of relations
- (relation = table)
- specifically

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Relational Database: Definitions

- *Relation:* made up of 2 parts:
 - Schema : specifies name of relation, plus name and type of each column.
 - *Instance*: a *table*, with rows and columns.
 - #rows = *cardinality*
 - #fields = *degree / arity*



Relational Database: Definitions

- relation: a *set* of rows or *tuples*.
 - all rows are distinct
 - no order among rows (why?)


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


- Cardinality = 3, arity = 5,

- Q: do values in a column need to be distinct?

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




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






Primary Keys


- A set of fields is a <u>superkey</u> if:
 No two distinct tuples can have same values in all key fields
 A set of fields is a <u>key</u> for a relation if :
 - -minimal superkey

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










