


Project Statement

The Desk Organizer was the first free-design project in the first year. Exploring how furniture relates to architecture, looking at precedents of desk organizers, and applying constraints based on the design idea resulted in a full scale, wood model that extends the 60" studio desk. The project was developed with a grid based on the Fibonacci sequence, where the stacking of "sticks" created a spiral-like form. As part of the learning process, this project taught the fundamentals of wood jointery as well as wood to aluminum connections, stability as an effect of structure, and the ending results of varnishing wood. The highlight of the desk organizer is the seemingly abstract object with apparent functionality when objects fit through the cracks.
