# BUILDING ANALYSIS -- LIBRARIES, Pt.1

## MINDSET

We learn about architecture from great architecture! Building on your summer building study, this semester you will analyze libraries and apply lessons to your own design process for Proj.3. In preparation for Proj.3, we are going to start some of the preliminary leg work and research while finishing up Proj.2. Your work will be to study some existing libraries to expose the architectural intent, concept, and principles used by the architect, and understand how architecture can express ideas, manipulate function, and create experiences at many levels. In addition you should work to understand the library as a “building type” with certain common denominators and underlying assumptions (that can at times be challenged). *This is an architecture project.*

## WORK PROCESS:

**1) READ:** Please read the assigned essay on the history of the library building type in Pevsner’s The History of Building Types (1976), and the intro and conclusion of Webb’s book Building Libraries for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (2004) to begin to understand some of the questions that exist about the future of libraries.

**2) VISIT:** This weekend, and definitely by Mon. Sept. 27, visit two local Pittsburgh libraries (see attached list, divide them up by studio, a close one, and a far one), as well as three CMU libraries. Take graphic/visual notes on the specifics of each library, how they work, how they are set up, how they use light and technology, how they accommodate people and store data. Think about what they all have in common.

**3) LIBRARIES ASSIGNED:** On a separate sheet, each student has been assigned a well-known 20<sup>th</sup>-century library, including some older examples, and some very recent ones, even a few under construction, on which to do focused research for Part I of the building analysis project.

**4) RESEARCH:** Gather as much documentary evidence about your building as possible, especially any other analysis work that has been done on your library. Most valuable are design process sketches, structural diagrams and drawings, detailed plans & building sections, and other drawings that reveal space & structure. Try calling or writing the firm for extra documents!!

**5) DIAGRAM:** Then create a series of inventive, abstract diagrams to reveal the library’s most important ideas, experiences, programming, structure, aesthetics, etc. Be sure your diagrammatic representation reinforces the ideas. Work to invent clear, abstract, analytical diagrams explaining your findings.

**6) POSTER:** Compose a landscape-oriented 11x17 COLOR pdf using the template that will be provided (much like the project documentation) that documents your library through photos, drawings, plans, sections and your diagrams. Also provide basic ID info, and a bibliography of 2-4 sources of info where you gathered material (website, journals, or books). A pdf and a high quality color copy of your poster will be due **Mon. Sept 27**, and will be hung in the studios.
