1949 Housing Act - Creates funding for City housing agencies to create cheaper housing for all

"Surgery" for a city: urban economic redevelopment + slum clearance + housing development

Questions of houising type & geometry: move from low-rise rows to high-rise towers

Lake Meadows Housing, SOM with New York Life Insurance, 1952-59

Supported by Southside Planning Board (IIT + Reese Hospital + citizens)

First scheme - 2 giant slabs, 1950

Residents move to Dearborn Homes

Stateway Gardens (1952) and Robert Taylor Homes (1962) alongside Ryan Expressway
