HISTORY 109th FIELD ARTILLERY Wilkes-Barre, Penna.

The entrance of the United States into the Great War, in April, 1917, at once made the military organizations of the country assume an importance in the public eye which they had not enjoyed since the days of the Civil War. Particularly was this the case with regard to the National Guard Regiments. Instead of being looked upon as semi-social, semi-military organizations, they have come to be seriously considered as the country's line of defence, second only to the Regular Army itself, and destined, in all probability, to play a vital part in the mighty struggle upon which the Nation has entered.

It is because of this new interest in the Regiments of the National Guard that it becomes appropriate to compile at the outset of the war a record of the history and personnel of the 109th Field Artillery. Such a record will always have value to the men who have shared in its experience, and may perhaps in the unknown future assume an importance extending far beyond its immediate membership It is with this thought in mind that the present record has been compiled.

The One Hundred and Ninth Field Artillery was officially instituted by virtue of G. O. No. 22, Headquarters 28th Division, October 11, 1917, reading in part as follows:

The Ninth Infantry, National Guard of Pennsylvania, from which the Third Artillery was organized, was formed by the consolidation of companies from two infantry regiments, eight companies from the Ninth Infantry, N. G. P., and four companies from the Seventh Infantry, N. G. P., the Ninth Infantry having been officially instituted in 1879 and the Seventh Infantry in 1898, by virtue of S. O. 16: June 24, 1879, and G. O. 25: August 10, 1898, as follows:

GENERAL ORDERS

No. 25

I. The provisions of paragraph 2, General Orders No. 15, A. G. O., c. s., which directed the recruitment of "nine regiments of infantry, three troops of cavalry, and three batteries of artillery, to be divided equally among the First, Second and Third Brigades, each regiment to consist of three battalions of four companies each, but only two battalions to be recruited and organized at this time," are amended and six regiments of infantry of twelve companies each will be formed and two assigned to each brigade.

II. The assignments are as follows:

To First Brigade-Nineteenth and Twentieth Regiments.

To Second Brigade—Seventeenth and Twenty-first Regiments. To Third Brigade—Seventh and Eleventh Regiments.

III. The following regimental formations are announced:

SEVENTH REGIMENT, THIRD BRIGADE

Company A, Wilkes-Barre, Luzerne county, organized by transfer of former members of Ninth Regiment, N. G. P. Captain Stewart L. Barnes commanding.

Company B, Williamsport, Lycoming county, mustered June 21, Major William P. Clark, commanding

Company D, Sunbury, Northumberland county, mustered June 22, Captain William H. Heim. Company D, Hazleton, Luzerne county, mustered June 23, Captain Andrew Lee. Company E, Wilkes-Barre, Luzerne county, mustered June 24, Captain Arthur W. Jackson. Company F, Wanamie, Luzerne county, mustered June 25, Captain James A. Dewey. Company G, Plymouth, Luzerne county, mustered June 27, Captain Charles L, Péck.

VI. Brigade Commanders are hereby authorized to order election for field officers (one colonel, one lieutenant colonel, two majors), of regiments of infantry within their respective brigades. Field officers of regiments are chosen by ballot by commissioned officers of the companies composing the regiment. Transportation orders will be furnished from Brigade Headquarters. Officers will travel by shortest and most direct route. Returns of election will be forwarded without delay to the Adjutant General through intermediate headquarters.

After the Spanish-American War the Ninth Infantry was reorganized as a twelve company regiment by G. O. 25, A. G. O., June 13, 1899, with headquarters at Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

The Ninth Infantry always stood high on the records of the Office of the Adjutant General of Pennsylvania, but reached its highest efficiency in the year 1911, when it led the National Guard of Pennsylvania at both the Spring and Summer inspections, by the following records:

Colonel Asher Miner was appointed Colonel and General Inspector of Rifle Practice, May 2, 1895, commission expired August 19, 1903.

The Ninth Infantry N. G. P. reported at Mount Gretna, Pa., for its annual period of training on July 22, 1916, pursuant to instructions contained in G. O. 25, Headquarters National Guard Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pa., June 30, 1916, as amended by G. O. 31, Headquarters National Guard Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pa., dated July 11, 1917. On Thursday, July 27, 1916, General Thomas J. Stewart, the Adjutant General, N. G. P., informed Colonel Asher Miner, commanding Ninth Infantry that to conform to reorganization of the Army under the National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, it would be necessary to transfer the Ninth Infantry, N. G. P., into a regiment of field artillery and instructed him to immediately make preparations for such transfer. The regiment returned to home stations on Saturday, July 29, 1916, where the reorganization plans were commenced in anticipation of the official order for the transfer.

Of the organizations of the Ninth Infantry the following transformations were effected:

Battery A, 3d F. A. from Company G, (Hazleton, Pa.) 9th Infantry.

Battery B, 3d F. A. from Companies C, H and M (Pittston, Pa.) 9th Infantry. Battery C, 3d F. A. from Company I (Plymouth) and Company L (Nanti-

coke) 9th Infantry.

Battery D, 3d F. A. from Companies A and K (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry. Battery E, 3d F. A. from Companies B and E (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry. Battery F, 3d F. A. from Companies D and F (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry.

The transfer from infantry to artillery resulted in a reduction of the number of officers for artillery as compared with infantry and resulted in the following officers voluntarily accepting reduction in rank:

First Lieutenant O. RAYMOND SNYDER to Second Lieutenant.

Second Lieutenant WALTER S. GARMAN afterwards enlisted and became First Sergeant, Battery B.

Captain ERNEST R. WINTERS to First Lieutenant.

The officers rendered surplus by the reorganization were transferred to the supernumerary list of the National Guard of Pennsylvania.

The following order was issued by the Adjutant General, N. G. P., on August 10, 1916.

Commanding General Eastern Department directed to equip and send regiment to join Division in Southern Department as soon as practicable.

The regiment was a good shooting organization, the Figure of Merit for Rifle Practice and standing in 1911 and four previous years being as follows:

The Ninth Infantry was called out for service upon the occasion of the cyclone in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., August 9, 1890; the Homestead riots, July 10, 1892; the Hazleton riots, 1897, and was mustered into the United States service for the Spanish-American War 1898. The regiment on every occasion gave a good account of itself, but suffered no casualties, though it lost three officers and twenty-nine enlisted men in the Spanish-American War from the typhoid epidemic. The regiment was mustered into the United States service for the Spanish-American War 11, 1898, and mustered out October 28, 1898.

The Seventh Regiment Infantry, N. G. P., was organized in 1898, for the second call for Spanish-American War service, but owing to the early close of that war was never mustered into the United States service.

Upon the muster out of the Ninth Infantry from the United States service, the Seventh Infantry was disbanded, but Companies D, E, F and I were attached to the Ninth Infantry as Companies G, K, L and M and continued as part of the regiment until reorganized as the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery in 1916.

The Seventh Infantry was commanded during its entire existence by Colonel Asher Miner, commissioned as Colonel, August 19, 1898.

The Commanding Officers of the Ninth Infantry during its existence were:

Colonel G. MURRAY REYNOLDS, July 25, 1879, to May 19, 1885.

Colonel MORRIS J. KECK, June 10, 1885, to May 21, 1894.

Colonel WILLIAM C. PRICE, June 22, 1894, to June 22, 1897.

Colonel C. Bow DOUGHERTY, July 14, 1897, to April 10, 1906.

Colonel FRANK L. MCKEE, April 30, 1906, to January 2, 1907.

Colonel ASHER MINER, February 11, 1907, to February 10, 1912.

Colonel DORRANCE REYNOLDS, March 4, 1912, to March 7, 1916.

Colonel Asher Miner, March 7, 1916, to August 16, 1916.

Colonel C. Bow Dougherty was appointed Brigadier General, April 10, 1906, and Major General, Commanding the Pennsylvania Division, September 30, 1910, and was placed on the retired list on the expiration of his commission, September 29, 1915.

II. In accordance with the above quoted authority, the Ninth Infantry, Colonel Asher Miner commanding, will be converted into a regiment of field artillery, the organization of same to be as provided in the National Defense Act (Act of Congress approved June 3, 1916).

III. The Commanding Officer, Ninth Infantry, will proceed immediately to organize from the commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Ninth Infantry six field batteries with the proper complement of regimental and battalion commissioned and non-commissioned officers, also headquarters company and supply company.

V. The regiment of field artillery when organized and accepted will be designated "Third Pennsylvania Field

Artillery." VI. The officers and enlisted men of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery will report at their respective rendezvous

on Thursday, August 17, 1916. VII. The regiment will proceed to Mobilization Camp. Mount Gretna, on Friday, August 18, 1916, for physical examination and muster into United States service. Upon arrival of the regiment at Mobilization Camp, the Commanding Officer will report to Senior United States Mustering Officer for instructions as to muster-in.

By order of MARTIN G. BRUMBAUGH. Governor and Commander-in-Chief.

Pursuant to this order the organization of a field artillery regiment was immediately completed and Captain Ned B. Rehkopf, Field Artillery, U. S. A., inspected and mustered the various organizations of the regiment early in August.

The various units of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery assembled at their respective armories on the morning of August 17, 1916, and in accordance with order proceeded to Mount Gretna, Pa., arriving the same evening, where the regiment immediately went into camp and made preparations for muster into United States service, which was accomplished on September 8, 1916.

Under date of August 17, 1916, Captain Fred T. Cruse, Field Artillery, U.S. A., was appointed Lieutenant Colonel, National Guard of Pennsylvania, and assigned to Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery. He reported for duty to Colonel Miner on August 25, 1916. Colonel Cruse proved himself to be a very efficient and capable instructor in field artillery and the regiment progressed so that early in January it had advanced sufficiently far to commence its firing practice.

Having in view the possibility of further aggression upon the territory of the United States from Mexico and the necessity for the proper protection of that frontier, the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery was ordered, on September 30th, to proceed to El Paso, Texas, and departed that evening in three train sections and arrived on the morning of October 5th, where it became part of the 7th Division, National Guard, Commanded by Major General Charles M. Clement.

While the regiment was encamped at Mount Gretna, Captain Charles S. Blakely, Fifth U.S. Artillery, and Captain Emery T. Smith, Fifth U.S. Artillery, reported as Inspector-Instructors and remained with the regiment almost continuously until it returned from the Mexican border. Their services were of the greatest value, as they did everything in their power to aid the regiment and increase its efficiency, and when they left, the regiment sincerely regretted their departure.

Upon arrival at the border, the regiment immediately started on a systematic course in training for the duties of artillerymen, which continued until March 13, 1917, when it was ordered to proceed to its home station for muster out of Federal service, where it arrived on March 21st.

The departure of the Commanding General, 7th Division, from El Paso, early in January, necessitated the transfer of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery to the Eleventh Provisional Division (commanded by Brigadier General George Bell) of the El Paso District, commanded by Major General John J. Pershing.

The regiment was assigned for field artillery work to the divisional artillery commanded by Brigadier General, now Major General, E. St. John Greble, and was brigaded with the Eighth United States Field Artillery; the Brigade being commanded by Colonel Peyton C. March.

The organizations of the regiment, less Battery E, were mustered out of the United States Service on various dates to March 29, 1917, and immediately continued its armory drill instruction. Lieutenant Colonel Cruse, by decision of the War Department, was obliged to resign his commission as Lieutenant Colonel of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery and resume his rank in the Field Artillery, U. S. A.

On March 24, 1917, Major Dewey, owing to ill health, was transferred to the National Guard Reserve.

Pursuant to call of the President, July 3, 1917, for the German War, the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery mobilized at its various home stations Sunday morning, July 15, 1917, and assembled at 10 A. M. at Wilkes-Barre, Pa., where a church service was participated in by all organizations, with 1245 enlisted men and all officers present.

On Monday, July 16, 1917, the entire regiment went into camp at West Pittston, Pa., the camp being named Colonel Robert Bruce Ricketts, where it trained for active service until September 7th, when it was ordered by the Commanding General, Eastern Department, Governors Island, New York, to proceed to Camp Hancock, Augusta, Ga., to join the First Artillery Brigade. The regiment departed on that day and arrived at Camp Hancock, on September 11, 1917.

Under date of September 22, General Orders No. 37, Headquarters 28th Division announced the new numerical designation for the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery as the 109th Field Artillery, assigned to the 53d Field Artillery Brigade of the 28th Division, U. S. A.

On October 11, 1917, the 109th Field Artillery was reorganized under Tables of Reorganization, Series "A," 1917, and the strength increased from 1290 to 1447 enlisted men, and commissioned officers from 47 to 63.

To reach the war strength required under the reorganization, and to replace men discharged for physical disability, 162 men were transferred to this Regiment from the 101st Cavalry, U. S. N. G., formerly the 1st Cavalry, N. G. P., and 67 recruits were received from Wilkes-Barre and vicinity.

The entrance of the United States into the Great War, in April, 1917, at once made the military organizations of the country assume an importance in the public eye which they had not enjoyed since the days of the Civil War. Particularly was this the case with regard to the National Guard Regiments. Instead of being looked upon as semi-social, semi-military organizations, they have come to be seriously considered as the country's line of defence, second only to the Regular Army itself, and destined, in all probability, to play a vital part in the mighty struggle upon which the Nation has entered.

It is because of this new interest in the Regiments of the National Guard that it becomes appropriate to compile at the outset of the war a record of the history and personnel of the 109th Field Artillery. Such a record will always have value to the men who have shared in its experience, and may perhaps in the unknown future assume an importance extending far beyond its immediate membership It is with this thought in mind that the present record has been compiled.

The One Hundred and Ninth Field Artillery was officially instituted by virtue of G. O. No. 22, Headquarters 28th Division, October 11, 1917, reading in part as follows:

HEADQUARTERS 28th DIVISION

CAMP HANCOCK, AUGUSTA, GEORGIA

October 11, 1917

1. Pursuant to instructions received from the Secretary of War, General Orders No. 14 and General Orders No. 18



After the Spanish-American War the Ninth Infantry was reorganized as a twelve company regiment by G. O. 25, A. G. O., June 13, 1899, with headquarters at Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

The Ninth Infantry always stood high on the records of the Office of the Adjutant General of Pennsylvania, but reached its highest efficiency in the year 1911, when it led the National Guard of Pennsylvania at both the Spring and Summer inspections, by the following records:

The Ninth Infantry, National Guard of Pennsylvania, from which the Third Artillery was organized, was formed by the consolidation of companies from two infantry regiments, eight companies from the Ninth Infantry, N. G. P., and four companies from the Seventh Infantry, N. G. P., the Ninth Infantry having been officially instituted in 1879 and the Seventh Infantry in 1898, by virtue of S. O. 16: June 24, 1879, and G. O. 25: August 10, 1898, as follows:

The Ninth Infantry was called out for service upon the occasion of the cyclone in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., August 9, 1890; the Homestead riots, July 10, 1892; the Hazleton riots, 1897, and was mustered into the United States service for the Spanish-American War 1898. The regiment on every occasion gave a good account of itself, but suffered no casualties, though it lost three officers and twenty-nine enlisted men in the Spanish-American War from the typhoid epidemic. The regiment was mustered into the United States service for the Spanish-American War May 11, 1898, and mustered out October 28, 1898.

The Seventh Regiment Infantry, N. G. P., was organized in 1898, for the second call for Spanish-American War service, but owing to the early close of that war was never mustered into the United States service.

Upon the muster out of the Ninth Infantry from the United States service, the Seventh Infantry was disbanded, but Companies D, E, F and I were attached to the Ninth Infantry as Companies G, K, L and M and continued as part of the regiment until reorganized as the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery in 1916.

The Seventh Infantry was commanded during its entire existence by Colonel Asher Miner, commissioned as Colonel, August 19, 1898.

Colonel C. Bow Dougherty was appointed Brigadier General, April 10, 1906, and Major General, Commanding the Pennsylvania Division, September 30, 1910, and was placed on the retired list on the expiration of his commission, September 29, 1915.

Colonel Asher Miner was appointed Colonel and General Inspector of Rifle Practice, May 2, 1895, commission expired August 19, 1903.

The Ninth Infantry N. G. P. reported at Mount Gretna, Pa., for its annual period of training on July 22, 1916, pursuant to instructions contained in G. O. 25, Headquarters National Guard Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pa., June 30, 1916, as amended by G. O. 31, Headquarters National Guard Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pa., dated July 11, 1917. On Thursday, July 27, 1916, General Thomas J. Stewart, the Adjutant General, N. G. P., informed Colonel Asher Miner, commanding Ninth Infantry that to conform to reorganization of the Army under the National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, it would be necessary to transfer the Ninth Infantry, N. G. P., into a regiment of field artillery and instructed him to immediately make preparations for such transfer. The regiment returned to home stations on Saturday, July 29, 1916, where the reorganization plans were commenced in anticipation of the official order for the transfer.

Of the organizations of the Ninth Infantry the following transformations were effected:

Battery A, 3d F. A. from Company G, (Hazleton, Pa.) 9th Infantry.

Battery B, 3d F. A. from Companies C, H and M (Pittston, Pa.) 9th Infantry. Battery C, 3d F. A. from Company I (Plymouth) and Company L (Nanticoke) 9th Infantry.

Battery D, 3d F. A. from Companies A and K (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry. Battery E, 3d F. A. from Companies B and E (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry.

Battery F, 3d F. A. from Companies D and F (Wilkes-Barre) 9th Infantry.

Will be assembled at Mount Gretna, Pa., August eighteenth, nineteen sixteen, and mustered into service as regiment light artillery according to organization National Defense Act. Commanding General Eastern Depart-ment directed to equip and send regiment to join Division in Southern Department as soon as practicable.

The organizations of the regiment, less Battery E, were mustered out of the United States Service on various dates to March 29, 1917, and immediately continued its armory drill instruction. Lieutenant Colonel Cruse, by decision of the War Department, was obliged to resign his commission as Lieutenant Colonel of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery and resume his rank in the Field Artillery, U. S. A.

On March 24, 1917, Major Dewey, owing to ill health, was transferred to the National Guard Reserve.

Pursuant to call of the President, July 3, 1917, for the German War, the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery mobilized at its various home stations Sunday morning, July 15, 1917, and assembled at 10 A. M. at Wilkes-Barre, Pa., where a church service was participated in by all organizations, with 1245 enlisted men and all officers present.

On Monday, July 16, 1917, the entire regiment went into camp at West Pittston, Pa., the camp being named Colonel Robert Bruce Ricketts, where it trained for active service until September 7th, when it was ordered by the Commanding General, Eastern Department, Governors Island, New York, to proceed to Camp Hancock, Augusta, Ga., to join the First Artillery Brigade. The regiment departed on that day and arrived at Camp Hancock, on September 11, 1917.

Under date of September 22, General Orders No. 37, Headquarters 28th Division announced the new numerical designation for the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery as the 109th Field Artillery, assigned to the 53d Field Artillery Brigade of the 28th Division, U. S. A.

On October 11, 1917, the 109th Field Artillery was reorganized under Tables of Reorganization, Series "A," 1917, and the strength increased from 1290 to 1447 enlisted men, and commissioned officers from 47 to 63.

To reach the war strength required under the reorganization, and to replace men discharged for physical disability, 162 men were transferred to this Regiment from the 101st Cavalry, U. S. N. G., formerly the 1st Cavalry, N. G. P., and 67 recruits were received from Wilkes-Barre and vicinity.

II. In accordance with the above quoted authority, the Ninth Infantry, Colonel Asher Miner commanding, will be converted into a regiment of field artillery, the organization of same to be as provided in the National Defense Act (Act

of Congress approved June 3, 1916). III. The Commanding Officer, Ninth Infantry, will proceed immediately to organize from the commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Ninth Infantry six field batteries with the proper complement of regimental and battalion com-missioned and non-commissioned officers, also headquarters company and supply company.

V. The regiment of field artillery when organized and accepted will be designated "Third Pennsylvania Field

Artillery." VI. The officers and enlisted men of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery will report at their respective rendezvous

 VII. The regiment will proceed to Mobilization Camp, Mount Gretna, on Friday, August 18, 1916, for physical examination and muster into United States service. Upon arrival of the regiment at Mobilization Camp, the Commanding Officer will report to Senior United States Mustering Officer for instructions as to muster-in.

Pursuant to this order the organization of a field artillery regiment was immediately completed and Captain Ned B. Rehkopf, Field Artillery, U. S. A., inspected and mustered the various organizations of the regiment early in August.

The various units of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery assembled at their respective armories on the morning of August 17, 1916, and in accordance with order proceeded to Mount Gretna, Pa., arriving the same evening, where the regiment immediately went into camp and made preparations for muster into United States service, which was accomplished on September 8, 1916.

Under date of August 17, 1916, Captain Fred T. Cruse, Field Artillery, U.S. A., was appointed Lieutenant Colonel, National Guard of Pennsylvania, and assigned to Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery. He reported for duty to Colonel Miner on August 25, 1916. Colonel Cruse proved himself to be a very efficient and capable instructor in field artillery and the regiment progressed so that early in January it had advanced sufficiently far to commence its firing practice.


Having in view the possibility of further aggression upon the territory of the United States from Mexico and the necessity for the proper protection of that frontier, the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery was ordered, on September 30th, to proceed to El Paso, Texas, and departed that evening in three train sections and arrived on the morning of October 5th, where it became part of the 7th Division, National Guard, Commanded by Major General Charles M. Clement.

While the regiment was encamped at Mount Gretna, Captain Charles S. Blakely, Fifth U.S. Artillery, and Captain Emery T. Smith, Fifth U.S. Artillery, reported as Inspector-Instructors and remained with the regiment almost continuously until it returned from the Mexican border. Their services were of the greatest value, as they did everything in their power to aid the regiment and increase its efficiency, and when they left, the regiment sincerely regretted their departure.

Upon arrival at the border, the regiment immediately started on a systematic course in training for the duties of artillerymen, which continued until March 13, 1917, when it was ordered to proceed to its home station for muster out of Federal service, where it arrived on March 21st.

The departure of the Commanding General, 7th Division, from El Paso, early in January, necessitated the transfer of the Third Pennsylvania Field Artillery to the Eleventh Provisional Division (commanded by Brigadier General George Bell) of the El Paso District, commanded by Major General John J. Pershing.

The regiment was assigned for field artillery work to the divisional artillery commanded by Brigadier General, now Major General, E. St. John Greble, and was brigaded with the Eighth United States Field Artillery; the Brigade being commanded by Colonel Peyton C. March.
